Principal's Report

We have had an eventful start to Semester 2. Students have attended both whole school and year level assemblies, participated in the zone cross country, rehearsed for the SRC's annual Music Madness on 25 July and the school production, 'the Wiz', which starts its run on 13 August.

While staff have been involved in each of these activities they have also attended a staff meeting, school council sub-committee meetings, student management meetings, hosted a delegation of New Zealand teachers and participated in three professional development activities. Twenty staff are involved in a program of six sessions with Tracy Ezard which is focussed on developing leadership potential. This week all staff participated in a mid-cycle professional conversation with their reviewer as part of the college Performance and Development process.

After school on Wednesday 16 July the whole staff participated in a three hour professional development session conducted by Darryn Kruse. The session was titled 'The Mindful Learner: Making Thinking Explicit'. This was a follow up to the curriculum day that Darryn conducted at Brentwood last October when the theme was 'the Mindful Classroom'. Thinking was also the theme of the curriculum day that Brentwood held in April which was run by Jason Clarke from 'Minds@Work'.

'Thinking and Learning' has been the Priority One in the last two School Charters for our college.

Brentwood Secondary College Charter 2004-2007:

To develop enhanced teaching practices that focus on:

- *the development of high order cognitive skills such as analysis, synthesis, evaluation, critical thinking and problem solving*

- *metacognition*
- *elearning*
- *learning how to learn.*

The 'Thinking' Domain in VELs is reported on in all subjects taught at our college from year 7 to year 10. Teachers are keen to develop their skill at using strategies which motivate students to think, to organise and document their learning and to develop a deeper understanding of the content that is taught.

Darryn Kruse is a highly regarded educator and author who is also a practising teacher in a Victorian state secondary college. One of the maxims of our college is that we are a 'learning community' and the staff are very receptive to Darryn's ideas. They appreciate the very practical, 'hands on' approach that he brings to his sessions and respond positively to having activities that they can take away and immediately use with their classes. We each learn best, that which we can see and hear. The aim is to make thinking visible for our students with teachers encouraging the use of simple tools and techniques which then become routine for students. Through this explicit teaching of thinking strategies, which are reinforced across all faculties, students will develop confidence and a learning disposition which is open to new ideas and ways of learning. Darryn will return in September to conduct another professional development session after school in which he will again share his ideas and expertise with our staff.

Education Maintenance Allowance

The Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is provided to assist eligible families with the costs associated with the education of their children.

To be eligible for receipt of the EMA you must:

- be either a parent or guardian of a secondary school student up to the age of sixteen; and
- be an eligible beneficiary of a Centrelink pension, allowance or benefit within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004 or be a Veterans Affairs (TPI) pensioner or be a foster parent.

Consequently parents/guardians are able to access the EMA if they have a current Health Care Card or Pension Card.

The eligibility criteria for instalment two must be met at the first day of Term 3 (14 July 2008). The EMA application must be submitted to the school by 1 August 2008 for the second instalment.

The EMA provides an annual amount of \$430 for secondary students and is paid in two instalments.

Parents with continuing eligibility, who were paid the first instalment of 2008 through this school will not be required to complete a new application for the second instalment. Parents who transfer children to another school after 29 February 2008 and prior to or on 1 August 2008, must reapply at the new school for the second instalment.

Application forms are available from the school office.

World Vision Global Leadership Convention Report

On 20 June, as representatives of the SRC we attended the Global Leadership Convention run by World Vision Australia.

The GLC is an annual event designed to equip students with the leadership qualities necessary to make an impact on global injustices. This year, World Vision is focusing on the issue of child labour in India, and this was the main theme of the convention. During the day, we attended several workshops, among the most memorable a real life workshop where we toiled as bonded labourers making matchboxes for two hours.

Nothing had prepared us for the truly horrific conditions we endured but we realised that real child labourers suffer far worse everyday, including real violence and abuse. Nothing was good enough for our employers, we were constantly heckled and verbally abused and slowly had our “privileges” taken away, such as lights and stationary, making it even harder to meet the impossible standards. Of course, this was only a demonstration, but it is a reality for thousands of children in India.

We then listened to an ex-child labourer named Rahini, who was working in a matchbox factory to pay off a debt, borrowed for her sister’s wedding. But, with over 1000% interest, the odds of her working this off were slim to none. This really brought home how real and wide spread this problem is in the world, even today, when slavery is supposedly abolished. Luckily, Rahini’s debt was paid off by World Vision and she got the chance to attend school. She is now training to be a nurse.

Afterwards we participated in various leadership workshops that equipped us with the skills and knowledge to make this year’s 40 Hour Famine better than ever!

Booklets for the 40 Hour Famine are now available in the Wellbeing office. If you would like to make a difference to the thousands of lives like those of Rahini and her family, pick one up and go without something for 40 Hours on 15-17 August.
