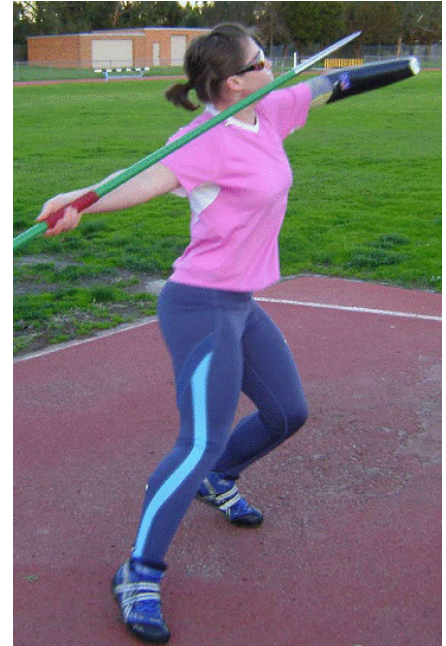
Principal's Report

Congratulations Maddy

Madeleine Hogan was a student at Brentwood Secondary College from 2001 to 2006. On Tuesday of this week at the Beijing Paralympic games Maddy won a bronze medal in the javelin. The Beijing games are the first Paralympic games that Maddy has attended. She achieved a Personal Best on her final throw which was measured at 38.89 metres, more than three metres further than she had ever thrown before. Maddy's throw was further than the standing world record which was also broken by the gold and silver medallists. Prior to the games Maddy's PB was 35 metres so the following comment to the media was perhaps not surprising. "I didn't really consider myself a medal chance. This is just something I didn't dare dream about."



Maddy was an enthusiastic sports participant during her time at Brentwood and was awarded a sporting excellence award in her final year at the college. Winning a bronze medal in Beijing is an absolutely inspirational achievement and I am certain that every member of the Brentwood community would wish to congratulate Maddy.
