Principal's Report

The College Uniform

Brentwood Secondary College has a uniform policy that is strictly enforced by all staff and the vast majority of our students come to school immaculately groomed every day. The wearing of correct school uniform engenders a sense of belonging for our students and demonstrates pride in our college community. School is a place of learning, a place of work and the dress code is appropriate for this more formal environment than the casual clothes that students may choose to wear when they are away from school. The excellent manner in which Brentwood students wear their uniform is often commented upon by members of the wider community in their dealings with our college. It is certainly a point of discernment between our college and other secondary colleges.

Hence at times it is necessary to remind students and parents of some aspects of the uniform policy which have been passed by the college council. The expectations of students in wearing the college uniform is clearly specified in the Student Planner pages iv & v.

On this occasion we need to remind students and parents about the policy on jewellery and body piercings:

- *Students should not be wearing jewellery other than a watch or simple studs/sleepers (one per ear).*
- *Any other form of visible body piercing is not permitted.*
- *Students will be required to remove nose, eyebrow (and lip) rings (studs/bolts) immediately.*

Taping over the piercing and its piece of jewellery is not permitted. Those students who wish to have piercings are asked to have this done in the summer holidays when healing time is maximised.

Parents are asked to support the college to ensure that their child observes the uniform policy and does not wear piercings to school.

Students' qualities as learners are developed by students continually and consciously 'doing the right thing' and 'doing the thing right' over a five to six week period; one or two weeks is not enough.

Encouraging them to give it a go, will benefit your son/daughter's progress immensely and be very rewarding and satisfying.

World Challenge Nepal 2010

At Brentwood, we offer an excellent opportunity for students to not only travel to a developing nation but to make a difference while they are there. World Challenge is an organisation which holds a contract with Brentwood Secondary College to provide an 18-20 month Challenge for students who wish to partake. The Challenge revolves around one central premise: students plan, fundraise and lead their own expedition. The Challenge begins with fundraising, training, team-building, budgeting and planning. These activities take place over a year and a half and as the expedition nears, the preparation and activities become more and more exciting. In November 2010, the World Challenge Challengers will depart Australia and head to Nepal to complete their Challenge by trekking through the Himalayas, working in a community and exploring all that makes Nepal a vibrant and captivating country.

In the early part of the year, an information evening was held for parents of students (in years 9 and 10) who were interested in joining World Challenge Nepal 2010. We had approximately 75 people attend this evening where a World Challenge representative gave an informative presentation about the Challenge including information on how Challengers in the past have achieved the fundraising goals. While the price for this 18-20 month commitment is high and is expected to be raised solely by the Challengers themselves (both through group and individual fundraising efforts), it is essential for the Challengers to recognise that this is part of the Challenge. The students who have committed to this Challenge already are currently writing letters, making phone calls, applying for jobs and organising and planning Sausage Sizzles at Bunnings, Bake Sales and other fundraising ventures to help them toward their goal. These

students are enthusiastic, optimistic and come to each meeting full of ideas and excitement.

Unfortunately, the number of students who have committed to take on the Challenge of Nepal 2010 is quite low. While this will not mean that the Challengers will miss out on the exciting, life changing experience that World Challenge expeditions provide, it does make it difficult for these students to maintain their enthusiasm when numbers are low.

As this is such a unique opportunity for our students on behalf of the college I would again like to invite students and their parents to consider participating in this venture. If you are a student in years 9, 10 or even 11 and you are interested in adventures, problem solving, challenging yourself and making a difference then you would be a perfect World Challenge Challenger for Nepal 2010.

There is a cost involved and it will be a challenge to raise the funds. It is my understanding that it is this cost which has kept many young people at Brentwood from taking up this Challenge. It is understandable how this part of the commitment would fill most with trepidation but to that I would like to remind students and parents alike of something that Michael Jordan has said about difficult tasks: "If you're trying to achieve, there will be roadblocks. I've had them; everybody has had them. But obstacles don't have to stop you. If you run into a wall, don't turn around and give up. Figure out how to climb it, go through it, or work around it."

It is my hope that there will be more interest from the Brentwood community in this wonderful opportunity. If you are interested, come and see me in my office in G-Block. Brentwood wins State Softball Title (AGAIN!)

Congratulations to all members of the victorious Brentwood intermediate softball team who defeated Bentleigh Secondary College in the final game at Gilbert Park, Knox on Wednesday May 20.

The final began as a close affair with neither team scoring in the first innings, but powerful batting by the Brentwood girls led by Tiarne, and consistent pitching by Kat, proved too much for the Bentleigh team to respond to. To the delight of a large band of parents, grandparents, siblings and Brentwood staff supporting the team, the girls played attacking softball to break the game open and put the match beyond their opposition's reach. The final score was 12 -2.

The majority of the team was comprised of year 9 girls who have progressed together from year 7 students without much knowledge of the sport, to finish third in the State in 2007, then in 2008 winning the year 8 title, to this year nailing the consecutive title despite being mostly bottom age

in the Intermediate competition. This would not have been possible without the addition of three awesome year 10 students; Jenn, Kat and Tiarne who not only led by example but raised the playing standard of all the girls around them.

Cassie was again a fantastic team captain and caught the majority of our games. Her throwing out of several runners stealing to second was a big highlight of our games, and she consistently got on base as our lead off batter.
