### Principal's Report

#### Parent/Teacher Interviews

As reported in previous newsletters this year the college has had to implement new arrangements for parent-teacher interviews. The college conducted two parent-teacher interview sessions with families being asked to attend in alphabetical groupings according to their last name. The sessions were conducted from 4:30 – 7:30pm on the last Thursday of term 1 and the first Thursday of term 2. Teachers noticed quite a change in attendance by college families with some teachers being over-booked for one session and quiet for the other. The maths faculty was fully booked for both afternoons and interviews with English teachers were consistent with past years. However, many teachers in the other five faculties reported far fewer interviews.

We will need to review how best to conduct parent-teacher nights as we try to balance the needs of parents to have access to staff and the work load of teachers within the Victorian Schools Agreement. The green slip that parents sign to acknowledge that they have received their child's report each semester also provides us with an opportunity to ask for parent feedback regarding parent-teacher interviews. The change in arrangements for parent-teacher interviews particularly for secondary schools is a matter of considerable debate within the Victorian education community.

#### School Audits

The audit of college finances was conducted by the accounting firm Davidsons on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> April. A written report will be forwarded to Mr Tom Schouten as President of School Council and to me. The matters raised by the auditors pertained to minor changes in practice now required by DEECD. I would like to acknowledge the work of the college Business Manager Graham Harvey not only for the work load in preparing for the audit, but also that college finances are conducted with efficiency and meticulousness. The annual auditor's report is testimony to his leadership of this crucial area of school operations.

The audit of the 2009 February School Census of student enrolments will be conducted on 15 May. The audit is conducted by an

independent consultancy firm. This audit directly impacts on the funding of the college through the Student Resource Package (SRP). All data pertaining to student enrolments and attendance at every year level is checked. The auditors have the authority to call for teacher's attendance records for their classes to validate attendance recorded in Home Group rolls. Mrs Jan Smith is the college Attendance Officer. She works closely with Assistant Principal Leon Lilly, the Heads of School and Student Managers to ensure that attendance records are accurate and that absences are supported with notes from parents and/or medical certificates.

#### Privacy Victoria

Brentwood has been selected to be the school at which Privacy Victoria will launch a short on-line animated video on 6 May which is during Privacy Awareness Week 3-9 May. The video is to alert young people in particular to the dangers of the naive use of social media and to think before they upload anything onto the internet. The video and posters will be distributed to audiences in Australia, New Zealand, South Korea, Hong Kong and Canada. It is an honour for our college to have been approached to host this event.

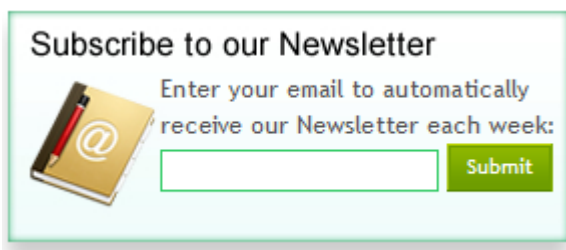

## Calculator Requirements for National Numeracy Tests

The National Numeracy Tests for years 7 and 9 will be run on Thursday 14 May. There are two numeracy tests, one that allows the use of a calculator and one which does not. It will be necessary for all year 7 and 9 students to bring a calculator to school on that day.

### Year 9

Year 9 students are already required to have a scientific calculator as part of their regular maths equipment (as specified on the year 9 booklist). Year 9 students who do not have a scientific

calculator should organise to purchase one from the college (from the main office at a cost of \$22).

### Year 7

At year 7 our focus is on improving the mental arithmetic and by hand maths skills of students, to assist with this goal we do not specify a calculator as part of the regular year 7 maths equipment. Therefore, for the National Numeracy test we are asking all year 7 students to bring a basic calculator from home.

We would like all year 7 students to bring this calculator to school each day starting Monday 4 May and continue to do so until after the National tests have concluded. This will give staff the opportunity to ensure that students correctly understand the use of their calculator.

Any year 7 student who does not have access to a suitable calculator should inform their teacher of this as soon as possible.

### Congratulations

This term is a very busy time in Senior School. Please keep the following information about upcoming exams and camps so that you can refer to it as needed throughout the term.

### GAT (General Achievement Test)

All students completing any Unit 3 and 4 study in 2009, including studies undertaken at VSL or other external providers, are required to sit the GAT on Thursday June 11. Students MUST attend in full school uniform and must bring photo ID.

### Year 10 Examination Period

Exams for year 10 students will be held from June 5 to June 10. Students must attend all exams in full school uniform and must bring photo ID. Students are permitted to bring water in a clear container with no label.

### Year 11 Central Australia Tour

Parents are reminded that we have a parent meeting on Tuesday May 12 at 7.00 – 8.00 pm in the Senior Learning Centre. Both parents and students are invited to this meeting to hear final information about the tour and meet staff attending this tour. Students attending the Central Australia trip will be expected to catch up on missed work as normal classes will be operating whilst they are away.

### Year 11 Seminar

### **VSSSA: State Swimming**

Congratulations to our swimmers who competed at the Victorian Secondary Schools State Swimming Championships at the end of last term. This was the first time that the VSSSA have used the outdoor pool at MSAC – this pool was purpose built for the 2006 Commonwealth Games. Throughout the day, like the 2006 Commonwealth Games, there were many records broken.

Marko Ivosev, a year 10 student, had a full day of competition with five individual events. The standard of competition was high and pushed Marko to swim at his best.

Marko placed 5<sup>th</sup> in the open 100m Breaststroke, 4<sup>th</sup> in the open 100m Butterfly and 16 years 50m Breaststroke. He won Silver in the 200 Individual Medley, and Bronze in the 16 years 50m Butterfly. Marko was also awarded Eastern Zone Age Group Champion for being the most successful 16 year old male swimmer. Excellent achievements!!

The 16 year female freestyle relay team also represented Brentwood at the State Championships – Georgia Corbett, Amanda Duong, Jacinta Dyson & Jacqueline Feinberg. These girls were super pumped to compete after winning at the Eastern Zone finals. Seeded 2<sup>nd</sup> and in lane five they were quietly excited about the possibility of winning a medal! This is the first time they have been to the state finals and in an extremely close race for second and third they won the Bronze medal (0.08sec behind the Silver). A fantastic effort!!

Our second relay team, the 17-20 years female medley relay team, were also stoked to be at the championships after a good win at Eastern Zone – Danielle Baldwin, Bec Corbett (sick), Carly Ioannidis, Debbie Ng, Sandra Thong. After a late withdrawal from our emergency and a panic on the morning of the championships, all was calmed when Carly Ioannidis filled in for the girls (a big

THANK YOU!). The girls placed 7<sup>th</sup> in their event which had teams from all around Victoria. Well done!

Thank you also to Mr Lilly who transported the senior girls so they could attend their VCE classes in the morning.

### **Footy Fun Run**

Brentwood's Footy Fun Run to be held on Thursday April 30 is the House Cross Country event and the selection trials into Brentwood's Cross Country Team. Students are allowed to wear casual dress on this day, and it is highly recommended that students be properly attired (ie wear runners) for the fun run. Students are encouraged to wear their football team colours (AFL, soccer, rugby). Please ensure your child has appropriate protection for all types of weather conditions, from a sun hat and sunscreen to warm clothes if cold. Students will attend periods 1 and 2 as normal classes, and then be bussed to Napier Park and from Jells Park for the Footy Fun Run.

All girls and the 12-13 years, 14years, and 15 years boys complete the 3km course. The 16 years, 17years & 18-20 years boys complete the 5km course. At the end of the event students have a sausage sizzle lunch, house activities and a kick of the footy before heading back to school to be dismissed.

### **So what Interschool sports can I try out for in Term 2?**

Interschool sports available for year's 7-10 students to try out for are badminton, soccer, football and netball. All four sports are available for both boys and girls. Remember students will need to listen to the *daily student bulletin* for meeting times, try outs and training sessions when advertised. You are most welcome to try out for more than one sport but you can only commit to one sport as they are all played on the same day at different venues.

Senior students (year 11 & 12) – this is your last round robin day for the year. You have the choice to compete in badminton, soccer, netball, football, table tennis, squash, hockey and basketball.

### **Sports Uniform**

Students and student coaches need to be in the full Brentwood Sports uniform – BSC navy blue shorts, BSC navy blue polo, and BSC spray jacket/rugby jumper. Casual clothing is not tolerated - students will be asked to remain at school and they will not be allowed to compete if in casual clothes. Teams can be penalised at competitions. As the weather (hopefully) turns colder students will need to wear warmer clothes to interschool sporting competitions. Students may need to purchase the navy blue track pants, these pants have no stripes down the side, no fancy logo, and are navy blue (same as BSC sports polo). Also parents please label all uniform items – it can't be returned to your child if there is no name on it. Thank you for your cooperation.

When students return to Brentwood, from Interschool sporting competitions, they will be asked to remain near the gym with their coach until the final 3.04pm bell is rung for dismissal. Senior students (year 11 & 12) are able to sign out in the SLC. If a team returns before the commencement of period 6 or the commencement of an earlier class, students will be required to attend the remainder of classes for the day.

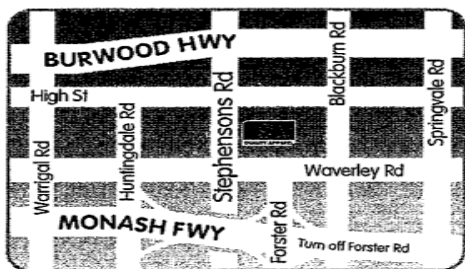
